a.) Chair's report: Technical Council Items

Vision 2010:

- Acoustics has to be more visible, achievements in Acoustics in different fields
- Improvement of our meetings
- New Online Journal suggested name (PASA- Proceedings of the Acoustical Society of America))
- Inter- Society Activities Committee
- New Technical Areas to extend the horizon, nanotech, Imaging, health issues

New online Journal discussion-

Bennett Brooks suggested that there would not be enough editorial controls

Opposition said that they will be enough editorial controls

Since there will be enough control then Bennett said that it might be fine

It is not a final decision now, but it is a work in progress

Will allow for the less technical papers that do not want to go through review process

If you find a bad paper, point it out to the editor

Unanimous vote to return to the council and tell them to proceed.

b.) ASA committees reports:

b1)JASA Associate Editors for Noise (Keith Attenborough, Ken Cunefare, Vladimir Ostashev, Brigitte Schulte-Fortkamp) had 30, 8 were rejected (Final Rejected), Some papers have been proposed that do not give new material and don't cite previous work, hard time finding reviewers

b2) JASA Express Letters (formerly ARLO) Associate Editor for Noise (Mike Stinson)

-Has stabilized, get about 10 manuscripts per month, very few from noise, multimedia and rapid turnaround

b5) ASACOS (Rich Peppin)

- ASA will offer five free ANSI/ASA standards to all members each year. This is a very nice benefit of membership, given standards cost a minimum of \$90.00 each
- Corporate members (members of S Committees) get copies of new standards as they are published.
- The designation of the standards produced by the S committees were discussed and voted upon. So, instead of for example, ANSI S1.xxx, it would read ASA/ANSI S1.xxx. This is to give better recognition to the role of ASA's development of the standards.
- A new standard, from S12 involves a non-normative spreadsheet that uses normative equations. This allows a simple approach to use the equations in a standard. (Not yet distributed: S12.68 on hearing protectors)
- Nominating committee: Hellweg, Chair, Peppin, Gaumont, Burkhard

- Standards only ran a 6% deficit last year, compared to 50% projected.
- Membership dues (of S Committees) will go up 3%
- ASACOS is asking all TPOM Reps of TCs to not schedule any session dealing with standards opposite any meetings of S committees and any ASACOS meeting.
- ASACOS voted to remove Standards News from JASA. *Will be available online*
- Susan Blaeser noted that ASA, in January, will have an on line proceedings journal on applied aspects of acoustics.
- ASACOS is suggesting that Bennett Brooks replace Rich Peppin on ASACOS as TC Noise rep.
- R. Hellweg was appointed ASA rep to ASACOS.
- Susan Blaeser has heard from Green buildings to be involved.
