Report for TC Noise from ASACOS

- ASACOS met November 11th, 2008
- ASACOS voted to allow an NAIS (Nationally Adopted International Standard) to be more stringent than the standard from which it is adopted. In other words, suppose there is an IEC standard (Say 804 on integrating sound level meters) and if ASA wants to adopt it as an ANSI standard it can and, if ASA wants, make it more rigorous than the original 804 standard. Ramifications: If it meets 804 it may not meet ANSI, if it meets ANSI it will meet 804.) Now I voted against this, not as TC Noise Rep but as Vice Chair of S1. It passed anyway.
